Quality Area 2: Children's Health and Safety

Policy 1: Healthy Food Supply & Nutrition

Bishop Kindergarten is committed to promoting healthy eating habits in line with the Right Bite Healthy Food Supply and Nutrition Policy for Preschools and Eat Well SA Schools and Preschools- Healthy Eating Guidelines

Children will:

- have access to tap water available at all times and be encouraged to drink water regularly throughout the day
- eat in a positive, social environment with staff who model healthy eating behaviours
- use the preschool garden to learn about and experience growing and harvesting nutritious foods
- learn to make healthy choices independently

Families will:

- be encouraged to provide healthy food and drink choices for children in line with the Right Bite Policy
- be encouraged to provide 'nude food' (reusable containers/wraps) to model sustainable environmental practices
- provide a drink bottle and ice brick in their child's lunchbox throughout the year

Staff will:

- promote and teach food safety curriculum including opportunities for children to develop practical food skills like preparing and cooking healthy food.
- promote and encourage correct hand washing procedures with children
- ensure healthy eating is part of the kindy program which includes experiences that provide knowledge, attitudes and skills to make positive healthy food choices

HEALTHY EATING ROUTINES

- All food and drink are kept in children's bags with an ice-brick in their lunchbox.
- Children may eat their snacks during play times after washing their hands.
- Children eat lunch together after washing their hands. During lunch staff are intentional about teaching the benefits of life style choices

ANAPHYLAXIS

- Children's food allergies are displayed for all staff to familiarise themselves with.
- General information about current food allergies is displayed for parents
- All new staff are inducted comprehensively to ensure they are aware of food, first aid and emergency procedures
- Vigilant supervision during eating times
- Staff to monitor resources for possible allergens

Notes:

- If a child has a serious food allergy (e.g. nuts), a separate policy for the duration of that child's involvement at Bishop Kindergarten will be developed and communicated to parents and staff.
- Staff are unable to **HEAT** children's food to meet food safety standards.

This policy has been established after consultation with staff and parents within the Bishop Kindergarten community.
